A. CALL TO ORDER

Acting Chair Huntsman called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

B. INTRODUCTIONS, PRESENTATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Director Mann presented a plaque to Lt. Harold Brady in appreciation of his outstanding service as the chair for the Law and Legal Subject Matter Expert Committee.

C. TRAINING AUDIT DEFICIENCIES FOR HOPI BIA POLICE DEPARTMENT

The BIA Hopi Police Department has one officer deficient in firearms training. As such, the Board should restrict certification until the deficiency has been taken care of.

Mr. Richard made a motion to restrict the certification of Officer Ivan Sidney for failure to complete annual training as required under R13-4-111 – Certification Retention Requirements. This restriction shall remain in effect until staff receives documentation correcting all remaining deficient training areas, seconded by Deputy Director Flanagan, motion carried unanimously.

D. TRAINING AUDIT DEFICIENCIES FOR ST. JOHNS POLICE DEPARTMENT

All training deficiencies were completed prior to today's meeting; this item was removed from the agenda.

E. TRAINING AUDIT DEFICIENCIES FOR TONTO APACHE TRIBAL POLICE

All training deficiencies were completed prior to today's meeting; this item was removed from the agenda.

F. FINAL ACTION CASES:

Case #1 – John Dematteo – Tombstone Marshal's Office

The Board considered comments from Assistant A. G. Diana Stabler. Ms. Larsen made a motion to adopt the Consent Agreement, Decision and Order and impose a 6-month suspension of peace officer certification beginning on February 13, 2009, and ending on August 13, 2009, seconded by Lt. Colonel Campbell, motion carried unanimously.

Case #2 – Calvin C. Ingram – Marana Police Department

The Board considered comments from Assistant A. G. Diana Stabler. Sheriff Armer made a motion to adopt the Consent Agreement, Decision and Order for voluntary relinquishment of peace officer certification, seconded by Lt. Colonel Campbell, motion carried unanimously.

Case #3 – William R. Queen – Bullhead City Police Department

The Board considered comments from Compliance Manager Bob Irish. Detective Dobbertin made a motion to adopt the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and revoke peace officer certification, seconded by Lt. Colonel Campbell, motion carried unanimously.

Case #4 – Gregory L. Schlosser – Ft. McDowell Tribal Police Department

The Board considered comments from Compliance Manager Bob Irish and Mr. Schlosser. Lt. Colonel Campbell made a motion to adopt the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and revoke peace officer certification, seconded by Detective Dobbertin, motion carried unanimously.

Case #5 – Corrina L. Thinn – Navajo Police Department

The Board considered comments from Compliance Manager Bob Irish and Ms. Thinn. Ms. Stabler addressed the Board and advised that the Findings of Fact should be amended to reflect that there was no fractured radius and the word physical added before provocation. Chief Kotsur made a motion to adopt the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and impose an 18-month suspension of peace officer certification effective from the date of termination, seconded by Mr. Richard, motion carried by a vote of 6-3.

Case #6 – Marysol O. Larrison – Phoenix Police Department

Mr. Richard and Lt. Colonel Campbell recused themselves from this case. The Board considered comments from Assistant A. G. Diana Stabler and Stephen Montoya, attorney for Officer Larrison. Sheriff Armer made a motion to adopt the Consent Agreement and Order of Suspension and impose a 21-day suspension of peace officer certification beginning on March 27, 2009, and ending on April 16, 2009, seconded by Detective Dobbertin, motion carried unanimously.

G. NEW CHARGING CASES:Case #1 – Robert M. Cormier – Mesa Police Department

The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Marie Dryer. Sheriff Armer made a motion to **Initiate Proceedings**, seconded by Dr. Decker, motion carried unanimously.

The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Ted Brandon. Chief Kotsur made a motion to **Initiate Proceedings**, seconded by Deputy Director Flanagan, motion carried unanimously.

Case #3 – Theodore W. Garrison – Peoria Police Department

The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Curt Milam. Mr. Richard made a motion to close this case with **No Action**, seconded by Chief Kotsur, motion carried unanimously.

Case #4 – Shawn S. Gilleland – Flagstaff Police Department

The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Gary Maschner. Lt. Colonel Campbell made a motion to **Initiate Proceedings**, seconded by Dr. Decker, motion carried unanimously.

Case #5 – Julio C. Iglesias – Goodyear Police Department

The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Gary Maschner. Sheriff Armer made a motion to close this case with **No Action**, seconded by Mr. Richard, motion carried unanimously.

Case #6 – Alexis Rodriguez – Hualapai Nation Police Department

The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Marie Dryer. Sheriff Armer made a motion to close this case with **No Action with Agency Discretion**, seconded by Lt. Colonel Campbell, motion carried unanimously.

Case #7 – David A. Slocum – Pima County Sheriff's Department

Detective Dobbertin recused herself from this case. The Board considered comments from Compliance Specialist Paul Orfe. Mr. Richard made a motion to **Initiate Proceedings**, seconded by Deputy Director Flanagan, motion carried unanimously.
