Out of town students: Double occupancy is required and a room list is provided to the hotel. Each officer must sign in at the hotel desk upon arrival. AZ POST will pay for room and tax only. We cannot pay for any other room charges; i.e. telephone calls, room service, movie rental, laundry, etc. Officers on per diem may choose their own eating establishments and AZ POST will reimburse municipalities according to the current Arizona Reimbursement Rate Index, per officer. If you live within 50 miles of the class AZ POST cannot pay per diem.

If your Agency is not selected in the "lottery", your request (s) will be placed onto the "Wait List". All training requests received after the deadline will be placed on a waiting list, first-come, first-serve basis.

DRUG INVESTIGATION FOR PATROL OFFICERS
16 Hours - Continuing Training Credit

This class is recommended for the uniformed officer and will provide instruction and familiarization in the following topics: Basic Drug Overview to include safety considerations when encountering a Clandestine Laboratory, Mechanics of a Traffic Stop, to include Violator Interviews, Legal Issues, Search and Seizure Issues, Vehicle Smuggling Indicators, Commercial Vehicle Smuggling Indicators, Hidden Compartments, and related Laws. The students will also receive instruction on how to conduct Knock and Talk investigations and an overview of Interdiction Methods/ Indicators involving Hotel/Motels, Storage Units, Parcels, and Stash Houses.
