Tactical Intelligence – Led Policing - Lake Havasu, AZ Feb, 7 – 8, 2012

This day and a half program is specifically for rural chief executives and command level personnel. The course examines the historical aspects of Intelligence-Led Policing (ILP) and promotes an understanding of the principles of this important law enforcement philosophy. Who Should Attend: Qualified applicants must be full-time, sworn law enforcement peace officers.

Eligibility: Preference for admission into this program is given to non-federal law enforcement officers or other emergency responders working in rural areas. "Rural" is defined as any area outside of a metropolitan statistical area (MSA), as defined by the Office of Management and Budget; or any jurisdiction inside of a MSA located in a county, borough, parish or land under the jurisdiction of an Indian Tribe with a population of no more than 50,000.
