If you live within 50 miles of the class AZ POST cannot pay per diem.

All training requests received after the deadline will be placed on a waiting list, first-come, first-serve basis.

**Fundamentals for Problem Shooters** 24 hours - Continuing or Proficiency Training Credit

This course is designed to enhance the attending instructor's skills involving the identification of and instruction of problem shooters. The class will consist of classroom instruction on identifying common and uncommon problems encountered while instructing firearms. Students will also participate in corrective range drills to allow for an opportunity to see them implemented. Attending instructors will be provided with materials related to the drills they will be able to take back to their departments for use.
