Human Trafficking Investigations 8 Hours – Continuing Training Credit

This program will focus on the issues of Human Trafficking faced by Arizona. It will allow officers to learn the critical indicators of human trafficking and acquire investigative techniques and tools to aid in the successful prosecution of those involved in this criminal endeavor. Human trafficking is not the same as human smuggling. The differences will be discussed in this class as well as other topics to include, but not limited to: Trafficking Victims Protection Act, reasons why persons are trafficked, indicators of trafficking, key components to include in reports and resources available in Arizona to aid in prosecution. This course is designed for all levels of law enforcement experience.
